

Sample Itinerary Options – Organic Agriculture: Sustainability on the Table

Talk to us before selecting four commercial organic production systems from the following list. We can advise on distances between sites and what options make a feasible one day tour. Or you might like to extend the tour over two or more days – simply multiply the daily fee by the number of days available to you.

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| Farm 1. | Cropping and milling rice, and fat lambs |
| Farm 2. | Cropping and milling wheat/spelt/oats, and fat lambs |
| Farm 3. | Free range eggs |
| Farm 4. | Sheep and opportunistic broadacre cereal cropping (includes farm stay option) |
| Farm 5 | Organic wines |
| Farm 6 | Free range pigs |
| Farm 7 | Free range pigs |
| Farm 8 | Cropping and milling wheat and rye |
| Farm 9 | Large scale irrigated vegetables |
| Farm 10 | Pork, honey, vegetables, herbs, olives, bardi grubs, lamb meat. (This interesting farm is part of an experimental teaching and research centre.) |
| Factory 1 & 2 | Producers of organic fertilisers and soil conditioners |
| Factory 3 | Producer of organic liquorice and chocolate |
| Farm 11 | Vegetables and tree crops |
| Farm 12 | Citrus, mixed fruits, vegetables |
| Farm 13 | Rice, olives and other tree crops, vegetables and herbs |
| Farm 14 | Fat lambs and wool |
| Farm 15 | Garlic, cereals, fat lambs, beef |
| Farm 16 | Hazelnuts |
| Farm 17 | Olives and fat lambs |
